A BILL

To amend the Banks and Bank Holidays Act, 1912, and certain other Acts.

B^E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Banks and Short title. Bank Holidays (Amendment) Act, 1929."

(2) The Banks and Bank Holidays Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, is herein referred to as the Principal Act.

(3) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Banks and Bank Holidays (Amendment) Act, 1912–1929.

Banks and Bank Holidays (Amendment).

2. The Principal Act is amended—

- (a) by omitting from subsection three of section Sec. 5.
 five the words "Chief Secretary to be laid (Quarterly abstracts.) before the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, and published in the Gazette" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "Government Statistician, who shall cause such quarterly abstract and statement to be published in the Gazette";
- (b) by omitting from section six the words "Chief Sec. 6. Secretary" wherever occurring and by insert- (Penalty.) ing in lieu thereof the words "Government Statistician";
- (c) by inserting next after section six the following New s. 6A. new section :--

6A. (1) The provisions of this Part shall not Exemptions. apply to any company, firm, or individual who is required by section 60AD of the Commonwealth Bank Act, 1911–1924, to furnish quarterly returns and who would, but for the provisions of this section, be required to furnish the returns prescribed in this Part.

(2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Part, it shall be a sufficient compliance with the requirements of this Part if the information required to be prepared or furnished is prepared or furnished in a form in or to the effect of the Second and Third Schedules and forwarded to the Government Statistician.

- (d) by omitting sections sixteen, seventeen, and Secs. 16, 17, eighteen, and subsection two of section twenty-^{18, 22} (2). two;

(1) The Governor may by proclamation Proclamation in the Gazette appoint a special day or the of a public afternoon or the morning of a day to be half-holiday or a observed as a public holiday either throughout New South Wales or in any part thereof or in any city, municipality, shire, or district therein.

(2) The proclamation shall be published at least seven days before the public holiday so appointed.

(3) The part of a day so appointed shall not in respect of business at a bank within the locality be a reasonable hour within the meaning of any law relating to bills of exchange or be within banking or business hours within any law practice or custom relating to banks or bankers.

(4) Any day or part of a day so appointed shall be kept as a close holiday in all banks within the locality mentioned in the proclamation.
