A BILL

To sanction the construction and equipment of works for the manufacture of Portland cement at Carlos Gap; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Carlos Gap Short title: Cement Works Act, 1927."

2. The construction and equipment of the works described in the Schedule are hereby sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works is authorised and empowered to carry out such works. ^{Works sanctioned.}

3. The cost of carrying out the said works is estimated at three hundred and fifty thousand two hundred and fifty pounds, and such estimated cost shall not under any circumstances be exceeded by more than ten per centum. ^{Cost.}

4. The plan of the works is the plan marked "Carlos Gap Cement Works," signed by the Secretary for Public Works, countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Harbours, Roads, and Bridges, and deposited in the public office of the said Minister. ^{The plan.}

SCHEDULE.

THE works will be situated near Carlos Gap, on the Mudgee Railway line, and will be capable of the manufacture of 75,000 tons of cement annually.

The necessary plant and machinery will comprise boilers, quarrying and mining plant, water supply machinery, construction of dams for water storage, crushing and grinding machinery, kilns, railway and aerial ropeways, electrically-driven motors, air compressors, and all other appurtenances for the manufacture of Portland cement.
