A BILL

To amend the Customs Regulation Act, 1879.

BE it (enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. The Colonial Treasurer shall, out of the Consolidated Payment to chairman Revenue Fund, pay to each Commissioner of Customs a fee of three and other members guineas for every attendance by such Commissioner at the meetings of Commissioners of But where any one of the Commissioners is appointed by Customs. the board. the Colonial Treasurer to be chairman of the board (which appointment he is hereby authorised to make), there shall be paid as aforesaid to the said chairman, in lieu of the fees above mentioned, the annual sum of one hundred pounds, and the said sum is hereby specially appropriated for that purpose.

2. If any Commissioner is, without the sanction of the Colonial Absence of Treasurer, absent for three months consecutively from the meetings Commissioners from of the hourd he shall be deemed to have any investigation of the of the board, he shall be deemed to have resigned his office as Com-board. missioner :: Provided that no absence shall be sanctioned by the Colonial Treasurer for a longer period than six months.

Any Commissioner may, by writing under his hand, addressed to the Gowernor, resign his office, in which case, or in the case of the death or removal from office of a Commissioner or his absence as aforesaid firom the meetings of the board, the Governor may appoint a Commissioner in his place.

3. Section twenty-nine of the Customs Regulation Act, 1879, Repeal. is hereby repealed.

4. This Act shall apply in respect of any Commissioner appointed Application of Act. after the day of the commencement of this Act and in respect of any Commissioner appointed before and holding office on the said day, notwithstamding that the term for which such Commissioner was appointed has not expired.

5. This Act shall be construed as one with the Customs Regu-Incorporation and lation Act, 1879, and may be cited as the "Customs (Commissioners') short title. Act, 1897.
