A BILL

To amend the Diseases in Sheep Act of 1866, and the Diseases
in Sheep Acts Amendment Act of 1878.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. For the purposes of the Diseases in Sheep Act of 1866 (30 Vic. No. 16), and the Diseases in Sheep Acts Amendment Act of 1878 (41 Vic. No. 19) "Travelling stock" means stock driven or carried by land or water along or over any place whatsoever other than the run on which they are ordinarily depastured.

Definitions of travelling sheep and travelling stock.

And the definition of that expression in the above-mentioned Acts is hereby repealed.

2. The provisions of section forty-one of the Diseases in Sheep Acts Amendment Act of 1878 (41 Vic. No. 19), applicable in respect of a muster intended to be made for the purpose of shearing, branding, marking, or weaning any sheep shall apply in respect of a muster intended to be made for the purpose of removing any sheep from the run in which they are ordinarily depastured.

Extension of section 41 of Act of 1878 to removal of sheep.

3. This Act may be cited as the "Diseases in Sheep (Amendment) Act, 1898."
