A BILL

To amend the Dog and Goat Act, 1898.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Dog and Goat Short title. (Amendment) Act, 1917."

2. The Dog and Goat Act, 1898, is amended as Amendments of Principal Act.

(1) Section seven, subsection one—
s. (7) 1.

(a) by omitting the words "two shillings and sixpence" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "five shillings"; and

184-(2) (b)

(b) by inserting at the end of the subsection the

following:

Provided also that every farmer, shepherd, or drover shall be entitled to have registered any number of dogs, not exceeding three, kept solely for the purpose of herding or driving sheep or cattle on payment of one-half the abovementioned fees, and on his making and lodging or sending, together with his application for registration, a declaration in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto.

Every person who makes any such declaration, knowing the same to be false, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding *five* pounds.

(2) Section ten, by omitting the words "two sec. 10. shillings and sixpence" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "the prescribed fee for registration".
