## A BILL

To penalise persons entering into or enforcing certain agreements in restraint of marriage; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as the "Employees Marriage short title. Act, 1914."
- 2. (1) Any person who, either as principal or agent, Persons makes or enters into or enforces or seeks to enforce any making or enforcing rule, order, regulation, contract, agreement, or arrange-agreements in ment in restraint of, or with intent to restrain, or prevent marriage the marriage of any person who is in his employment or liable. in the employment of his principal, or who is seeking to enter such employment, and who is of the age of twenty-one years or over, shall be liable to imprisonment for months, or to a penalty not exceeding pounds.

(2) The provisions of this Act shall apply to corporations, so far as they are capable of being so applied.
