A BILL

To amend the Friendly Societies Act, 1912-1935, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Friendly Societies (Amendment) Act, 1941."

Short title and citation.

(2) The Friendly Societies Act, 1912-1935, as amended by subsequent Acts, including this Act, may be cited as the Friendly Societies Act, 1912-1941.

Friendly Societies (Amendment).

2. The Friendly Societies Act, 1912-1935, as amended by subsequent Acts, is amended—

5 (a) (i) by omitting from paragraph (d) of subsection one of section ten the words "on travel in search of employment" and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "unemployed";

Sec. 10. (Compulsory registration of certain societies.)

10 (ii) by omitting from the same paragraph the words "or in case of shipwreck or loss or damage of or to boats or nets";

(b) by inserting at the end of subsection one of section seventy-three the words—

Sec. 73. (Reference of dispute to Registrar.)

15 Any such reference shall be made not later than six months after the date upon which the matter in dispute has been finally dealt with in accordance with the rules of the society or branch relating to the settlement of disputes.

20 (c) by inserting at the end of section seventy-four the words—

Sec. 74. (Reference of dispute to Registrar in cases of delay.)

Any such reference shall be made not later than six months after the date upon which the right to refer the dispute arises.

25 (d) by omitting from subsection two of section eighty-one the words "twenty per centum" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "twenty-five per centum."
