## A BILL

To amend the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912, the District Courts Act, 1912, and the Judges Retirement Act, 1918, in certain respects.

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

**1.** This Act may be cited as the "Industrial Arbitration (Amendment) Act, 1921." Short title.

**2.** Subsection seven of section thirteen of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912, is amended by inserting after paragraph (c) the following new paragraph:—

(d) where any additional judge is appointed to be also a district court judge, he shall not be entitled to any further or other salary than that to which he thereby becomes entitled as such district court judge.

**3.** Subsection one of section fourteen of the District Courts Act, 1912, is amended by inserting after the words “each of whom shall be” the words “a judge or additional judge of the court of industrial arbitration or.”

**4.** Subsection one of section eighteen of the District Courts Act, 1912, is amended by omitting the words “which sum” and substituting therefor the words “or in the case of a judge or additional judge of the court of industrial arbitration being appointed to be a district court judge, one thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds, which respective sums.”

**5.** Subsection three of section twenty of the District Courts Act, 1912, is amended by inserting after the words “has served as judge” the words “or as additional judge.”

**6.** Paragraph (c) of section four of the Judges Retirement Act, 1918, is amended by omitting the words “and any judge of a district court” and substituting therefor the words “and any such other judge becoming a district court judge and any other judge of a district court,” and by omitting the words “as such judge” and substituting therefor the words “in the position from which he is retiring.”
