A BILL

To provide in certain circumstances for the amalgamation of
Industrial and Reformatory Schools.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may, by proclamation in the *Gazette*, declare that any public industrial school therein mentioned, proclaimed as such under the Industrial Schools Act of 1866, or any part of such school as aforesaid, shall be a reformatory school within the meaning of the Reformatory Schools Act of 1866, and thereupon the provisions of the Reformatory Schools Act of 1866 shall apply to and in respect of any children sent to the school under that Act; but, except in respect of the said children nothing in this Act or in any proclamation thereunder shall affect the operation of the Industrial Schools Act of 1866 or any Act amending the same in respect of the said school.

Governor may declare a public industrial school to be a reformatory school.

2. This Act may be cited as the "Industrial and Reformatory Schools Act, 1896." Short title.
