A BILL

To amend the King's School Council Act, 1893, and the King's School Council (Amendment) Act, 1894.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows —

1. This Act may be cited as the "King's School Council (Amendment) Act, 1922." Short title.

King's School Council (Amendment).

2. Sections five and six of the King's School Council (Amendment) Act are hereby repealed, and in their place the following sections shall be substituted:—

5. The said council shall consist of sixteen members called governors, namely:—

- (a) The Archbishop of the Diocese of Sydney for the time being. 5
- (b) Ten governors appointed by the Synod of the Diocese of Sydney, of whom five shall be licensed clergymen of the Church of England in priest's orders, and five shall be lay members of the Church of England. 10
- (c) Five governors appointed by the King's School Old Boys' Union, who shall be members of the Church of England and also members of the said Union. 15

6. (a) Whenever a vacancy shall occur amongst the governors appointed by the synod, the synod shall appoint a new governor in place of the governor vacating office: Providing that if the synod be not in session when such vacancy occurs the standing committee of the synod may appoint a governor to hold office until the next ensuing synod. 20

(b) The governors to be appointed by the King's School Old Boys' Union shall hold office for five years, and shall be eligible for reappointment. The first appointment shall be made in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and appointments shall be made in every fifth year thereafter. 25

(c) The synod and the union respectively may make regulations for carrying out the appointment of the governors to be appointed by them respectively. 30

3. Section ten of the King's School Council Act is hereby amended by substituting the word "seven" for the word "five" therein. 35
