A BILL

To provide for the closing of hotels for the sale of liquor on the morning of Anzac Day; to amend section fifty-seven of the Liquor Act, 1912, and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Liquor (Anzac Day) Amendment Act, 1934." Short title.

2. The Liquor Act, 1912, is amended by inserting in subsection one of section fifty-seven after the words "Christmas Day" the words "or upon the morning of the twenty-fifth day of April (Anzac Day) in each year." Amendment of Act No. 42, 1912, s. 57 (1). (Times when premises may not be open for sale of liquor.)
