B^E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Local Govern-Short title ment (Franchise) Act, 1914," and shall commence and and commencement. come into operation on the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen.

(2) In this Act "the Principal Act" means the Local Government Act, 1906, as amended by any later Acts.

55. Any person, male or female, being a natural Adult suffrage born or naturalised British subject, who on the day in municiprescribed resides or has his principal place of abode in any ward or undivided municipality, and whose name is included in any roll in force under the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act, 1912, or any Act amending that Act, shall be entitled to be placed on the list as a "resident" and to be enrolled as an elector on the roll for such ward or undivided municipality, as the case may be.
