# A BILL

To amend the Lotteries and Art Unions Act,  
1901 ; and for other purposes.

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty,  
by and with the advice and consent of the  
Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New  
South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the  
authority of the same, as follows :—

**1.** This Act may be cited as the " Lotteries and Art Unions (Amendment) Act, 1919." Short title.

**2.** (1) Section three of the Lotteries and Art Unions Act, 1901, is amended by inserting the word "land" before the words "goods, wares, or merchandise" wherever occurring in that section. Selling or disposing of land by lottery prohibited.

(2) Section four of the same Act is amended by Sec. 4. omitting the word "articles" and substituting therefor the words "goods, wares, or merchandise."

(3) Section five of the same Act is amended by Sec. 5. inserting the following subsection next after subsection two:—

(2A) Any person contravening any of the terms Penalty for con- approved by the Attorney-General shall be liable travening terms to a penalty not exceeding *twenty* pounds. approved by

General.

**3.** Section nine of the Lotteries and Art Unions Act, New sec. 9. 1901, is repealed, and the following sections inserted:—

9. If any person—

- (a) in a street, sells or offers for sale any ticket in Penalty for a lottery; or selling tickets  
in or near  
to streets.
- (b) in a right-of-way, doorway, or on any private land adjoining a street, sells or offers for sale to any person in such street, any ticket in a lottery,

he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding *ten* pounds.

10. Any penalty imposed by this Act may be New sec. 10. recovered in a summary way before any stipendiary Recovery of or police magistrate or any two justices of the peace penalties. in petty sessions.

11. Any prize unclaimed by the person holding New sec. 11. the ticket entitling him thereto, or by some person Unclaimed duly authorised in that behalf, for a period of three prizes. months after the drawing of the lottery, shall be sold by public auction and the proceeds of the sale paid into the fund for which the art union was formed.
