# A BILL

To amend the Lotteries and Art Unions Act,  
1901 ; and for other purposes.

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty,  
by and with the advice and consent of the  
Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New  
South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the  
authority of the same, as follows :—

**1.** This Act may be cited as the " Lotteries and Art Unions (Amendment) Act, 1914." Short title.

**2.** (1) Section three of the Lotteries and Art Unions Act, 1901, is amended by inserting the word "land" before the words "goods, wares, or merchandise" wherever occurring in that section. Selling or disposing of land by lottery prohibited.

(2) Section four of the same Act is amended by omitting the word "articles" and substituting therefor the words "goods, wares, or merchandise."

3. Section nine of the Lotteries and Art Unions Act, 1901, is repealed, and the following sections are substituted for it:—

- 9. If any person—
  - (a) in a street, sells or offers for sale any ticket in a lottery; or
  - (b) in a right-of-way, doorway, or on any private land adjoining a street, sells or offers for sale to any person in such street, any ticket in a lottery,

Penalty for selling tickets in or near to streets.

he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding *ten* pounds.

10. Any penalty imposed by this Act may be recovered in a summary way before any stipendiary or police magistrate or any two justices of the peace in petty sessions.
