## A BILL

## To amend the Lotteries and Art Unions Act, 1901 ; and for other purposes.

$\mathbf{B E}^{\mathrm{E}}$ it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. This Act may be cited as the "Lotteries and Art Short title. Unions (Amendment) Act, 1914."
2. (1) Section three of the Lotteries and Art Unions Selling or Act, 1901, is amended by inserting the word "land" disingoing of before the words "goods, wares, or merchandise" land by wherever occurring in that section.

(2) Section four of the same Act is amended by omitting the word " articles" and substituting therefor the words " goods, wares, or merchandise."
3. Section nine of the Lotteries and Art Unions Act, New 1901, is repealed, and the following sections are sub- section 9. stituted for it:
4. If any person-
(a) in a street, sells or offers for sale any ticket in

Penalty for selling tickets in or near to streets.
(b) in a right-of-way, doorway, or on any private land adjoining a street, sells or offers for sale to any person in such street, any ticket in a lottery,
he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.
10. Any penalty imposed by this Act may be New recovered in a summary way before any stipendiary section 10 . or police magistrate or any two justices of the peace $\begin{gathered}\text { Recovery of } \\ \text { pent. }\end{gathered}$ in petty sessions.
