A BILL

To amend the law relating to Newspapers.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Locialatics Course the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. 2. This Act may be cited as the "Newspapers Act, 1896."
