## A BILL

To vest in the Trustees of the National Park all oysters on land vested in those trustees; to make the stealing of such oysters an offence; and to amend the Oyster Fisheries Act of 1884.

E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. All oysters on any land vested in the corporation known as Oysters on the the Trustees of the National Park are hereby declared to be the National Park to be vested in the property of the said corporation: And whosoever steals any such oysters Trustees. or receives any such oysters, knowing them to have been stolen, shall be guilty of felony and shall be liable to penal servitude for a period not exceeding three years:

Provided that where a person takes oysters on any such land and consumes them there, he shall not thereby be guilty of the offence of stealing such oysters.

2. Section ten of the Oyster Fisheries Act of 1884 is hereby Repeal and repealed, and in lieu thereof it is enacted that if any person dredges re-enactment with amendments of s. 10 for or takes oysters from any leased area or from any beds or deposits of the Oyster on Crown lands, except under special permit, he shall incur a penalty Fisheries Act of 1884.

for every offence not exceeding fifty pounds.

3. This Act may be cited as the "Oyster Fisheries Protection short title.
