A BILL

To preserve certain rights to superannuation allowances, or refunds and gratuities under the Civil Service Act of 1884, and the Public Service Act, 1902, and any Acts amending the same in the case of persons retained in or transferred to the service of the Commonwealth who are reappointed to the Public Service of New South Wales; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Public Service (Transferred Officers' Appointment) Act, 1910." Short title.

2. Where a person who was in the Public Service of New South Wales has, before or after the commencement of this Act, been—

(a) retained in the service of the Commonwealth on the transfer of a department of the Public Service of New South Wales to the Commonwealth; or

(b) transferred to the Public Service of the Commonwealth.

Certain rights to superannuation allowances or refunds and gratuities preserved to transferred officers reappointed to the State Service.

And where such person has at any time before or after the said commencement, but subsequently to such retainer or transfer, been appointed to the Public Service of New South Wales, he shall be and be deemed to have been as from the date of such appointment entitled to continue to contribute to the superannuation account, and shall on retirement or removal from such Public Service otherwise than for an offence be entitled to a superannuation allowance or refund and gratuity, as the case may be, under the Civil Service Act of 1884 and the Public Service Act, 1902, or any Acts amending the same, as if his service in the Public Service of New South Wales had been continuous: Provided that service in the Public Service of the Commonwealth shall not be counted in computing the scale of such superannuation allowance.
