A BILL

[STATE BAKERY DISTRICT, 1914.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "State Bakery District Act, 1914."

It shall commence and come into force on the day of , one thousand nine hundred and

State Bakery District.

2. The Governor, by notification in the Gazette, may proclaim a district for the purposes of this Act, and may in like manner amend any such proclamation. Such district shall be situated within one mile of the State bakery, Stanmore.

3. There shall not be sold or delivered within such district any bread other than that sold by or delivered from the said State bakery.

If any person contravenes the provisions of this section he shall for each offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding _____ pounds.

4. (1) Compensation for loss of trade due to the operation of this Act shall be paid from the Consolidated Revenue Fund to every baker who on the seventeenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and during the fortnight next preceding the said day, sold and delivered bread within the said district, and who within one month after the commencement of this Act makes application to the Minister for such compensation.

(2) The amount of such compensation may be determined by agreement between such baker and a person appointed by the Minister, or, failing such agreement, by a stipendiary magistrate having jurisdiction within the said district, whose determination of such amount shall be final: Provided that such amount shall not exceed eight shillings for every house within the said district at which, on the day above-mentioned, the said baker has delivered bread.

5. Penalties under this Act may be recovered in a summary way before a stipendiary magistrate in petty sessions.
