A BILL

To authorise, within a certain district, the establishment of State fish markets for the wholesale sale of fish; to regulate and control the use of such markets, and the wholesale sale of fish in such district; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "State Fish Markets Short title. Act, 1916," and shall come into force on the day . one thousand nine hundred and .

2. The Governor may, within the metropolitan police Establish. district, establish State fish markets for the wholesale ment of State fish markets. sale of fish.

3. For the abovementioned purpose the Governor Acquisition

may acquire land.

For the purpose of such acquisition the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1912, and any Acts amending it shall apply as if such acquisition were for an authorised work.

4. The Governor may appoint a manager for such Appointment State fish markets and such other officers and servants and other

as may be necessary.

After a date to be notified by the Minister in the Fish not to Gazette any person who, within the metropolitan police be sold whole-sale except at district, sells fish wholesale at any place other than the the State State fish markets established under this Act shall be markets. liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

Regulations.

6. The Governor may make regulations regulating the use, letting, and occupation of the

State fish markets or any portion thereof; regulating the conduct of persons using such markets, resorting thereto, or buying, selling,

or dealing therein;

preventing and suppressing nuisances, and enforcing cleanliness in and in connection with such markets, and providing for and regulating the storage, removal, treatment, and disposal of garbage, offal, waste, slops, and sewage;

prescribing how, when, by whom, and under what conditions and restrictions such fish markets. or any part thereof, may be used and occupied;

defining the duties and powers of officers and

servants;

providing for the inspection of fish, and for the seizure and destruction of diseased fish or fish which are unfit for human consumption, which may be brought to, or be in, or about, or be exposed or offered for sale in such fish markets:

prescribing, fixing, levying, and collecting rents, tolls, fees, and charges for the use of or in

connection with such fish markets:

fixing

fixing, levying, and collecting fees for inspection of fish:

fixing any penalties not exceeding twenty pounds for any breach of the regulations;

generally for carrying into effect the purposes and provisions of this Act.

(2) Such regulations shall— (i) be published in the Gazette;

(ii) take effect from the date of publication, or from a later date to be specified in such

regulations; and

(iii) be laid before both Houses of Parliament within fourteen days after publication if Parliament is in session, and, if not, then within fourteen days after the commencement of the next session. If either House of Parliament passes a resolution at any time within fifteen sitting days after such regulations have been laid before such House disallowing any regulation, such regulation shall thereupon cease to have effect.
