**B**<sup>E</sup> it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of <sup>5</sup> the same, as follows :—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "State Lotteries Short title. (Amendment) Act, 1934."

(2) This Act shall commence on a day to be appointed by the Governor and notified by proclamation 10 published in the Gazette.

(3) The State Lotteries Act, 1930, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the State Lotteries Act, 1930-1934.

Advertising.

2. The State Lotteries Act, 1930, is amended by inserting next after section six the following new section:-

6A. (1) Any person who for hire, gain or reward promotes or takes part in the formation of a syndicate for the purchase of a ticket in a State lottery shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding *one hundred* pounds.

(2) Any person who by any means advertises that he will receive money for a share in a ticket to 10 be purchased in a State lottery shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding *one hundred* pounds, and any person who prints or publishes any such advertisement shall be liable on summary conviction to a like penalty. 15
