A BILL

To regulate Sunday trading in certain shops; and for that purpose to amend certain Acts.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Sunday Trading (Refreshment Room) Act, 1912," and shall take effect on and from the day of

(2) In this Act—

"Proclaimed" means proclaimed by the Governor in the Gazette.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any Act of prior date, it shall be allowable for any shop described in Schedule One hereto, and situated in any locality described or mentioned in Schedule Two, to be open on Sundays during and within the following hours for the sale of the articles and commodities or other things named in Schedule Three:—

Certain shops may be opened for the sale of certain articles during certain hours.

Seven and ten in the morning, one and seven in the afternoon, half-past eight and ten in the evening,

3. Any person opening, or keeping open, any such shop at other than the above prescribed hours and places, or selling in such shops during those hours any article, commodity, or thing not authorised to be sold under this Act, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding pounds, or to be imprisoned for a period not exceeding years.

Penalty.

4. The Governor may, on the requisition of the council of any municipality or shire, by proclamation in the Gazette, extend the provisions of this Act to any locality mentioned in such proclamation.

Governor may extend provisions.

SCHEDULES.

SCHEDULE ONE.

- Restaurants or dining rooms.
- Refreshment or tea rooms.
- Confectioners' or lolly shops.
- Fruiterers' shops.
- Pastrycooks or bakers, for the sale of bread in various forms, cakes or biscuits.
- Temperance, non-alcoholic, or "soft" drink shops.
- Ice-cream shops.
- Milk shops
- Fish and oyster shops, or saloons, for the sale of fish (cooked) and oysters.
- Any shop in combination of any of the above.

SCHEDULE TWO.

- (1.) All picnic grounds, parks, recreation reserves, and sea beaches within twenty miles of the General Post Office, Sydney, which may be proclaimed under this Act.
- (2.) All picnic grounds, parks, and recreation reserves within miles of any town, provided such town is proclaimed under this Act.
- (3.) The Circular Quay and any wharf or place which may be proclaimed under this Act.

SCHEDULE THREE.

- Meals.
- Tea, coffee, cocoa, chocolate, or other similar drinks.
- Temperance, non-alcoholic, or "soft" drinks.
- Ice-cream.
- Bread in various forms, pastry, cakes, or biscuits.
- Cooked fish.
- Oysters.
- Milk.
- Confectionery.
- Fruit of all kinds.
