A BILL

To provide that certain unclaimed moneys be paid to the Treasurer as public revenue; to give publicity to information relating to such moneys; and for other purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto.

B^E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Unclaimed Moneys Short title. Act, 1916."

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2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, Definition. the terms following in inverted commas have the respec- South Aus-1891, s. 2.

"Company" means-

- (a) every company which, having for its object the acquisition of gain, is registered or incorporated in New South Wales under any Act relating to companies; and
- (b) every company which, having for its object the acquisition of gain, and carrying on business in New South Wales aforesaid, is registered and incorporated elsewhere than in New South Wales; and shall include
- (c) every bank and life assurance company or association, howsoever or wheresoever registered or incorporated, carrying on business within the said State, and includes the liquidator of any company.
- "Owner" means the person entitled to any unclaimed moneys, and includes his executors, administrators, or assigns, or his or their lawful attorney or agent in New South Wales.
- "Unclaimed moneys" means all principal and interest money, and all unforfeited dividends, bonuses, profits, and sums of money whatsoever which have been in the possession of any company for a period of six years or upwards, and in respect whereof no claim has been made by the owner against the company, and which arise out of any dealing had within the said State by any owner or person with the company.

3. It shall be the duty of every company, on the Register of first day of January in each year, to enter, in an unclaimed moneys to be alphabetical register to be kept by such company at its kept. head or principal office in New South Wales, in the South form set forth in the Schedule to this Act, and with the Act, No. 539, particulars therein specified, all unclaimed moneys of 1891, s. 3. exceeding ten pounds in an account which has not been operated upon for six years; and from and after the thirty-first day of January in each year such register shall be open to the inspection of any duly appointed Government

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Government officer at such head or principal office during the hours within which the company transacts its ordinary business.

4. A copy of every such register shall be forwarded Copy of annually during the month of January by the company register to be to the Colonial Treasurer for publication by him in the *Ibid. s. 4.* Gazette.

5. Any company failing to keep such register, or to Penalty. forward such copy, or refusing inspection thereof, shall ^{*Ibid. s. 5.*} be liable to a penalty not exceeding *two* pounds for every day during which such default or refusal continues.

6. (1) All unclaimed moneys which have not been Unclaimed paid by the company to the owner thereof within two moneys to be years after the first publication of such notice in the Treasurer as Gazette shall be paid by the company to the Colonial public revenue. Treasurer for the use of the public revenue.

(2) The company shall thereafter be relieved from all further liability in respect of the money so paid.

7. The Colonial Treasurer may, at any time after the Treasurer publication of any notice as aforesaid, examine any of $_{accounts, & cc.}^{may examine}$ publication of any notice as aforesaid, examine any of $_{accounts, & cc.}^{may examine}$ the accounts relating to the unclaimed moneys in such south Ausnotice referred to, and may for that purpose require the stralian Act, No. 539, of production before him, or before such public officer as 1891, s. 7. he may appoint, of any book, vouchers, or documents referring to such moneys; and if any error shall be found in any register or notice aforesaid, he may direct the register or notice, or both of them, to be amended.

8. If any claimant shall make any demand against Treasurer the Colonial Treasurer for any money paid to him, the fulclaimant. Colonial Treasurer, upon being satisfied that the *Ibid. s. 8.* claimant is the owner of the money demanded by him, shall order and direct payment thereof to be made to him.

9. When any unclaimed moneys paid to any claimant Treasurer not shall be afterwards claimed by any other person, the responsible for payment. Colonial Treasurer shall not be responsible for the pay- in certain ment of the same, but such person may have recourse cases. Ibid. s 9. against the claimant to whom the Colonial Treasurer *Ibid.* s 9. shall have paid the unclaimed moneys.
