A BILL

To prevent the use by unauthorised persons of the word Anzac, and certain other words and expressions; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "War Terms Short title. (Limitation of User) Act, 1920."

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise Definition. requires,—

“Prohibited word” means—

- (a) the word “Anzac” or any word resembling the word “Anzac”; or
- (b) the word or expression “Aussie,” “returned soldier,” “returned sailor,” “repatriation,” “Australian Imperial Force,” “A.I.F.”; or
- (c) any word or expression declared by the Governor, by notification in the Gazette, to be a prohibited word.

3. (1) Any person who, unless he shall have first Use of pro- obtained the authority of the Attorney-General, hibited word. proof whereof shall lie upon the person accused—

- (a) assumes or uses a prohibited word in connection with any trade, business, calling, or profession; or
- (b) uses a prohibited word as the name or part of the name of—
 - (i) any private residence; or
 - (ii) any boat or vehicle; or
 - (iii) any charitable or other institution or any building in connection therewith,

shall be guilty of an offence, and upon conviction before a stipendiary or police magistrate shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding *one hundred* pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding *three* months or to both penalty and imprisonment, or if the offender be a corporation, to a penalty not exceeding *two hundred* pounds.

(2) Without limiting the generality of the last preceding subsection a word or expression shall be deemed to be assumed or used by a person in connection with any trade, business, calling, or profession if—

- (a) it is applied to any goods manufactured, produced, sold, or offered for sale by that person; or
 - (b) it is used as the name or part of the name of any firm or company registered in New South Wales.
