Wild Flowers and Native Plants Protection (Amendment) Bill.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

The object of this Bill is to impose further restrictions on the sale of wild flowers and native plants. The Bill prohibits the sale of—

- (a) all protected wild flowers other than Christmas Bush which has been grown on private land;
- (b) all protected native plants other than native plants grown on private land and sold in a growing state.

A BILL

To make further provision for the protection of wild flowers and native plants; to amend the Wild Flowers and Native Plants Protection Act, 1927-1931, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

(1) Any person who during the protected 10 period picks a protected wild flower or protected native plant shall be guilty of an offence.

> Nothing contained in this subsection shall extend to the picking of any protected wild flower or protected native plant grown upon private land and picked with the consent of the owner or lessee of that land or to the picking of any protected wild flower or protected native plant in pursuance of a license issued under section 5A of this Act.

5. (1) Any person who sells or offers or

exposes for sale during the protected period—

(a) any protected wild flower, or

(b) any protected native plant other than a protected native plant which has been grown on private land and is sold in a growing state suitable for planting.

shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) Paragraph (a) of subsection one of this section shall not apply to or in respect of the flower of the native plant known by the botanical name of Ceratopetalum gummiferum (commonly known as Christmas Bush) where that plant has been grown on private land.
