(Relating to penalties)

The Maritime Services Board of New South Wales, in pursuance of the Maritime Services Act 1935, hereby makes the following Regulation:

Commencement

1. This Regulation commences on 1st April, 1991.

Amendments

- 2. The Boating (Safety Equipment) Regulation—N.S.W. is amended:
- (a) by omitting from clauses 17, 19, 20 and 22 the matter "\$400" wherever occurring and by inserting instead the matter "\$1,500";
- (b) by omitting from clauses 18 and 21 the matter "\$200" wherever occurring and by inserting instead the matter "\$1,500". Dated this 1st day of March, 1991.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The object of this Regulation is to amend the Boating (Safety Equipment) Regulation—N.S.W.:

- (a) to increase from \$400 to \$1,500 the penalties for:
 - (i) failure to carry prescribed equipment on a vessel; and
 - (ii) failure to carry on a vessel safety equipment complying with specified requirements; and
 - (iii) carrying safety equipment in poor condition; and
 - (iv) a person's showing distress signals without proper cause; and
- (b) to increase from \$200 to \$1,500 the penalties for failure to wear a lifejacket or buoyancy vest in a canoe or kayak as required and for not having safety equipment in a vessel so placed as to be readily accessible at all times.
