## Commencement

1. This Regulation commences on 1st October, 1991.

## Repeal

**2.** The Port Authority—Smoke Control—Regulations N.S.W. are repealed.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

The object of this Regulation is to repeal the Port Authority—Smoke Control—Regulations N.S.W. The Regulations prohibit the emission of certain categories of smoke or soot from vessels in port. This form of pollution is now regulated by the Clean Air Act 1961. Consequently, the Regulations are obsolete.
