#### Citation

1. This Regulation may be cited as the Occupational Health and Safety Legislation (Short Description of Offences) Regulation 1991.

# Commencement

2. This Regulation commences on 16th August, 1991.

# Short description of offences

- **3.** (1) For the purposes of section 145B (2) of the Justices Act 1902, the prescribed expression in relation to a summary offence specified in Column 1 of Schedule 1 is the expression set out opposite it in Column 2 of the Schedule.
- (2) If a choice of words is indicated in Column 2 of the Schedule the words remaining after the omission of the words irrelevant to the offence constitute the prescribed expression.
- (3) A reference in Column 1 of Schedule 1 to a provision of the Occupational Health and Safety Act 1983, the Factories, Shops and Industries Act 1962, the Construction Safety Act 1912, the Dangerous

Goods Act 1975 or any regulation made under those Acts, being a provision that creates an offence, is a reference to the provision as in force at the time the offence is alleged to have occurred.

# OFFENCE UNDER OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT 1983

# OFFENCE UNDER THE CONSTRUCTION SAFETY ACT 1912

Section 17 (1)—drive a power crane or power hoist used in building work or excavation work or a power hoist used for raising or lowering persons without holding an appropriate certificate of competency

drive power crane/hoist for building/excavation work/moving people while uncertified

Section 17 (2)—drive a power crane or power hoist contrary to the terms of the certificate of compliance held

drive power crane/hoist beyond certificate

### Section 17 (3):

(a) employ, instruct or allow a person not holding a certificate of competency to drive a power crane or power hoist employ/direct/allow uncertified person to drive power crane/hoist

- (b) employ, instruct or allow a person holding a certificate of competency to drive a power crane or power hoist contrary to the terms of that certificate
- Section 17 (8)—not comply with conditions of exemption granted in relation to provisions of section 17 (1), (2) or (3)
- Section 17A (1)—act as rigger, dogman, scaffolder, crane chaser, diver, powderman or explosive-powered tool operator without a certificate of competency
- Section 17A (1A)—act as rigger, dogman, scaffolder, crane chaser, diver, powderman or explosive-powered tool operator contrary to the terms of the certificate of competency held

Regulation 73 (2)—not provide and maintain safe means of access to place of work

Regulation 73 (3)—not provide means of securing the safety of a person liable to fall more than 1.8 m

Regulation 73 (6)—not provide adequate overhead protection for persons working below or in danger from falling objects

Regulation 73 (7)—not provide head protective helmet where overhead protection impracticable

Regulation 122 (5)—subject, or instruct, allow or permit a person to subject, a crane, lift, conveyor, hoist, scaffolding, plant or gear to greater load, or more adverse incidence or manner or condition of loading, than prescribed

# Regulation 127 (108):

- (a) being owner or person in charge of crane or hoist, not prevent unauthorised persons riding upon the load, the lifting hook, the platform or other lifting medium
- (b) ride upon the load, the lifting hook, the platform or other lifting medium of a crane or hoist without authority

Regulation 159D—being holder, not produce his or her certificate or permit to employer or inspector on demand

# OFFENCE UNDER THE DANGEROUS GOODS ACT 1975

Section 9 (1) (a)—keep dangerous goods in or on premises not licensed under section 8

# OFFENCE UNDER DANGEROUS GOODS REGULATION 1978

Clause 15B (4)—being in charge of vehicle used to carry dangerous goods, not carry or not produce driver registration card on request by inspector, police officer or authorised person

Clause 85—being depot licensee or unlicensed depot occupier, operate or cause, permit or suffer a person to operate an unapproved appliance in prescribed explosive gas zone use/cause/permit/suffer use of unapproved appliance in explosive gas zone

# OFFENCE UNDER THE FACTORIES, SHOPS AND INDUSTRIES ACT 1962

Section 27—being the occupier of factory, not securely fence all dangerous parts of factory machinery

Section 44A (1)—being the occupier of factory, not ensure that electrical installation, equipment and apparatus is designed, constructed, protected and maintained to eliminate risk of accidental electric shock or electrical fire

Section 45 (3)—being the occupier of factory, not maintain fire escape in good condition and free from obstruction

not securely fence machinery

electrical installation/ equipment/apparatus not designed/constructed/protected/ maintained to avoid shock/fire risk

not maintain fire escape in good condition/free from obstruction

# OFFENCE UNDER THE BOILER AND PRESSURE VESSEL REGULATIONS

Regulation 28—being the owner of a boiler or pressure vessel, use or cause, permit or allow use of the boiler or pressure vessel without a certificate of inspection being currently in force in relation to it

use/cause/permit/allow the use of uncertified boiler/pressure vessel

Regulation 41—use or cause, permit or allow the use of oxy-acetylene, electric welding or brazing processes to repair part of boiler or pressure vessel without approval

use/cause/permit/allow use of unapproved repair method on boiler/pressure vessel

Regulation 80—being the owner of the boiler or pressure vessel, work with or use or cause, permit or suffer a person to work with or use the boiler or pressure vessel when not maintained in safe working order or not correctly adjusted

work with/use/cause/permit/ suffer person to work with/use unsafe/wrongly adjusted boiler/pressure vessel

Regulation 80A—being the owner of the boiler, operate or cause, permit or allow the operation of the boiler without the continual supervision of an authorised boiler attendant or without the attendant's certificate or permit type and number being displayed adjacent to the boiler

use/cause/permit/allow use of boiler without prescribed supervision/supervisor's details displayed

#### Column 2

Regulation 82—cause pressure in boiler or pressure vessel to exceed safe maximum working pressure or tamper with valve or fitting so as to affect its proper working or conceal defects from inspector

cause excessive pressure/tamper with valve/fitting/conceal defects in boiler/pressure vessel

OFFENCE UNDER ENGINE DRIVERS AND BOILER ATTENDANTS CERTIFICATION REGULATIONS

Regulation 17 (2)—employ as an engine driver or boiler attendant a person who does not hold an appropriate class of certificate employ uncertified engine driver/boiler attendant

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

The object of this Regulation is to prescribe the short descriptions that, by virtue of section 145B of the Justices Act 1902, are sufficient to state or describe, in any information, complaint, summons, warrant, notice, order or other document, certain offences for which penalty notices may be served under section 51B of the Occupational Health and Safety Act 1983. This Regulation comprises matter of a machinery nature.
