EXPLANATORY NOTE

The object of this Proclamation is to commence amendments made to the Plant Diseases Act 1924 by the Statute Law (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1981. Those amendments relate to:

- the approval of forms etc. by the Chief, Division of Plant Industries, Department of Agriculture
- the making of orders setting standards for the grading, packaging and labelling of fruit, vegetables and other plants
- the repeal of certain provisions of the Plant Diseases Regulations.
